Praying For Your Child's Future Spouse

Next to the decision to commit one's life to Jesus Christ, marriage is the most important commitment that a person can ever make. It will affect the rest of his or her life along with the lives of their family members. An unwise decision in this matter can bring pain and misery for everyone involved. Since only God knows who will make the best marriage partner for anyone, He should be consulted first and He should give the final answer.

A parent may feel helpless in the matter of who his or her child decides to marry. Yet, this is simply not true. Through prayer, you can have a significant impact on who your child marries. Every parent hopes that his or her child will marry a compatible and godly mate. Prayer is essential in guiding them in that direction.

Magnificent weddings do not make perfect marriages. Only God can do that. The Word of God says, "There

are many plans in a man's heart, nevertheless the LORD's counsel—that

will stand (**Proverbs 19:21**)." It is neither the advice of friends nor the admiration of people that causes a couple to have a strong, godly marriage. It is not bridal consultants and caterers who set the bride and groom on the right path. Consulting God and following His leading do that. It is only the prayer of parents and concerned people that cause a child to seek continually the will of God instead of following their own emotions.

The following are some suggested prayer requests that you can use to pray about your child's future mate. You can use these or you could develop your own from them. These requests can be used in a variety of ways. A parent can use them to intercede for the child's future or present mate. Grandparents can use these requests to pray for the present or future mate of their grandchildren. concerned individual or youth minister can use them to pray for young people. A single person can use them to pray for their future mate. A single person can use them to seek God's guidance in this important matter. No matter how they are used, it is important to pray for the future mate of your child or the child of someone you love.

Father, I pray that his/her mate would enter into a personal relationship with God through Jesus Christ (John 3:16; Acts 4:12).

Father, I pray that You would protect him/her from the spirit of divorce, which is so common to this age (Malachi 2:14-16). No matter what age your child is, pray about this today. Divorce threatens everyone at some time or another. Stand against this and resist it from getting a grip in your child's life. If your child is already divorced, pray for all the brokenness to be healed and that there will be no more divorce in his or her future.

Lord, grant that he/she would hunger for You and seek to serve You with all his/her heart (Psalm 42:1-2, 63:1, Matthew 22:37).

Father, I pray that You would teach him/her the basics of spiritual warfare, how to flee temptation, how to take thoughts captive, and how to stand firm against the devil's schemes (1 Peter 5:8-9; 2 Corinthians 10:3-5; James 4:7-8).

Lord, I plead that You would teach him/her how to pray and would give him/her a heart for prayer (Colossians 4:2; Luke 18:1; 1 Thessalonians 5:18).

Father, enable him/her to remain a virgin until he/she is married. Guard him/her from immorality, "outercourse" (petting experiences), sexual abuse or harassment,

and exposure to pornography. Grant him/her a desire for sexual purity.

(Colossians 3:5; 1 Thessalonians 4:3-4; Ephesians 5:3).

I ask that You would show him/her what You want him/her to do with his/her life. Make Your will known to him/her. Cause him/her to seek Your will for his/her life (1 Corinthians 10:31; 1 Timothy 4:12).

I pray that he/she would be committed to truth and would choose honesty in every situation even when tempted to lie in order to lessen the consequences or the punishment (**Ephesians 4:25**).

Father, I plead that You would teach him/her to be a good parent. Grant his/her parents' good parenting skills and if not, provide him/her with good role models of parenting (Psalm 68:5-6; Matthew 6).

Lord, I pray that You would grant him/her a healthy, God-centered view of money and possessions. Help him/her have a proper attitude toward money in giving, working, and receiving. I ask that You would enable him/her to learn how to save, tithe, and budget money (1 Timothy 6:6-11).

Father, I ask that he/she would develop good communication skills. Enable

him/her to speak only those things that are good and uplifting. Guard him/her from profanity, foul language, and angry

responses (Colossians 3:8; Ephesians 4:29).

Lord, grant my child's mate deep and satisfying personal relationships that will prepare him/her for marriage but that will not compromise his/her purity. Teach him/her how to care and love for another person and deliver him/her from selfishness and self-centeredness (1 Thessalonians 4:3-8; Ephesians 5:22-33).

I ask that he/she would put away all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and evil speaking along with malice. I pray that he/she would grow in kindness toward others, would be tenderhearted and forgiving of others as God for Christ's sake has forgiven him/her (**Ephesians 4:31-32**).

Father, I pray that he/she would develop a servant's heart. I ask that he/she would be given a heart to serve others and not himself/herself (Matthew 20:28).

God, I ask that he/she will have a burning desire to share the gospel with others. Make him/her into a powerful witness of Your Son, Jesus Christ. Give him/her a vision for the world and a heart to support missions (Matthew 28:19-20; Acts 1:8).

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Father, I ask that You would grant him/her the desire and commitment to be an active part of Your Son's church. I plead that he/she will know his/her

spiritual gifts and will use them for Your glory and for the building up of Your Son's church (Hebrews 10:25; 1 Corinthians 12).

Lord, I plead that You would deal with anything in his/her life that would hinder or be destructive to his/her marriage. Enable him/her to overcome sins or character weaknesses that might do damage to the marriage relationship and to the children (Psalm 147:3, Galatians 5:22-23).

Lord God, I pray that he/she will love You with all his/her heart, soul, mind, and strength. Cause him/her to worship and serve no other God but You. Never allow anything to become more important to him/her than You (Matthew 22:37-38; Exodus 20:1-3; 1 John 5:21).

Father, I plead that he/she will love others as himself/herself. Create within him/her a compassion and a concern for others (Matthew 22:39).

Your prayers can have a significant impact on the kind of person that your child marries. They can also bring changes in the person to whom your child is already married. It is not that you should pray for the perfect mate for

your child. It is that you should pray for your child to marry someone who is becoming all God wants him or her to be.

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Praying Through Marital Problems

Every marriage is going to have times of difficulty. Problems will surface and they will be a threat to the joy and even the existence of the marriage. These problems could be due to a crisis or to ongoing problems of one or both of the spouses.

The devil will attempt to use these problems no matter how insignificant they seem. He will attempt to use these problems to cripple or even destroy the marriage. The way to prevent this is through prayer. Through prayer and dependence on God and His Word, a couple can overcome the problems that they are facing.

The following prayer list is offered as a guide that can help you pray through marital problems. You can also use this prayer list for the safeguarding of your marriage. If you have family members or friends that are having marital problems, you can use this list as a guide to intercede for them. This is especially true of in-laws (Remember in-laws: **Hands off, prayers on**).

• Pray that God would enable them to communicate with each other in a

clear and loving way (Ephesians 4:15; Proverbs 18:13).

- Pray that God would remind them of the value and preciousness of marriage (Genesis 2:22; Proverbs 18:22).
- Ask that God would enable them to find intimate and abiding joy in their love and friendship (Ecclesiastes 9:9; Proverbs 5:18).
- Pray that God would enable them to always be kind to each other, tenderhearted, and forgiving as God for Christ's sake has forgiven them (Ephesians 4:32).
- Plead that God would prevent Satan from gaining a foothold in their relationship (**Ephesians 4:25**).
- Pray that God would help them to always remember that love is a commitment and a choice (1 Corinthians 13).
- Ask that they would always trust in the Lord and would not lean on their own understanding (**Proverbs 3:5**).
- Pray that they would acknowledge the Lord in all their ways, keeping Him as the top priority of their lives (Proverbs 3:6).

- ◆ Ask that they will remember that hatred stirs up strife but love covers a multitude of sins (Proverbs 10:12).
- ◆ Pray that they will remember the seriousness of the commitment that they have made to God and to each other (Mark 10:5-9; Malachi 2:6).

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
